CN Canadian Women's Open On Track For Winnipeg

CN and the Royal Canadian Golf Association are proud to present the CN Canadian Women's Open, Canada's only LPGA event, at St. Charles Country Club in Winnipeg, Manitoba, from August 23rd - 29th, 2010.

In 2009, more than 67,000 spectators came out in Calgary to watch the stars of the LPGA, including the top 50 ranked players, compete in the CN Canadian Women's Open. Suzann Pettersen emerged as the champion and claimed her winner's share of the \$2,750,000 (US) purse.

The mandate of the CN Canadian Women's Open is to raise support for the care of sick children in the communities in which the event is hosted. In the past four years, the CN Canadian Women's Open, through the CN Miracle Match program and proceeds from the championship, has raised nearly \$3.6 million for children's hospitals. With your support in 2010, we can make a significant difference in the lives of children.

Volunteers Wanted!

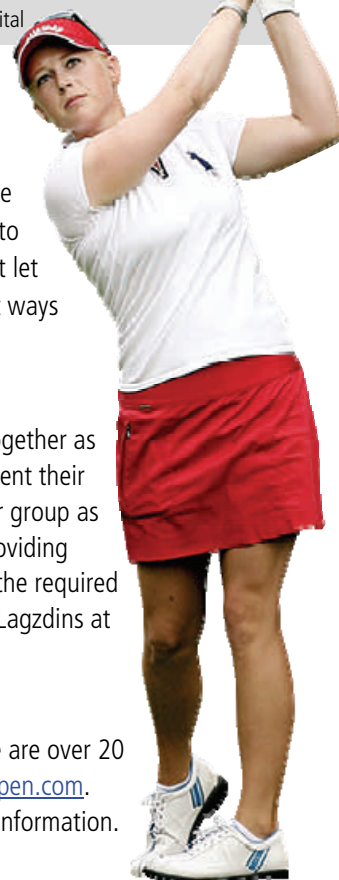

Meet Our Past Champions



Suzann Pettersen—2009 Champion

Seven-year LPGA Tour veteran Suzann Pettersen carded a final-round one-under par 70 (65-68-66-70=269, -15) to win the 2009 CN Canadian Women's Open at Priddis Greens Golf & Country Club in Calgary. The win marked Pettersen's first victory since 2007 and earned her the \$412,500 prize. Five players, Momoko Ueda, Morgan Pressel, Ai Miyazato, Angela Stanford and Karrie Webb, finished tied for second, five shots back at 10-under par.



Katherine Hull—2008 Champion

Five-year LPGA Tour veteran Katherine Hull (71-65-72-69=277, -11) overcame a six-stroke deficit at Ottawa Hunt & Golf Club to win the 2008 CN Canadian Women's Open. With the win Hull became a Rolex First-Time Winner and with her \$337,500 prize, she crossed the \$1 million mark in total career earnings. Hull edged her closest competitors – runner-up Se Ri Pak (-10) and third-place Yani Tseng (-9) – on the final day.



Lorena Ochoa—2007 Champion

In 2007, world No. 1 Lorena Ochoa continued her domination of the LPGA Tour firing a 2-under 69 at Royal Mayfair Golf Club in Edmonton to win the CN Canadian Women's Open. Ochoa beat runner-up Paula Creamer by 3 strokes to earn the \$337,500 prize and her 14th career win. Since her win, Ochoa has continued to place in the top-10 at the CN Canadian Women's Open. Ochoa also boasts 27 LPGA Tour victories and over \$14 million in career earnings.



Cristie Kerr—2006 Champion

Cristie Kerr made an eight-stroke comeback on the final day at London Hunt & Country Club to win the inaugural CN Canadian Women's Open and the \$255,000 prize. Angela Stanford, who led the first three rounds, bogeyed the final hole to surrender the win to Kerr. Since her win, Kerr has maintained her status as a fierce competitor by continually ranking among the top-10 on the official LPGA money list.
